Project Overview

While the emu remains common in many areas, along the east coast of Australia their distribution has severely retracted. Only a few small populations along the east coast of NSW remain. To assess the likelihood that these populations will persist into the future, we need help to estimate population size within these four populations

What's required?

- What's required: Volunteers to drive two 3-5km transects each, four times in 2017 (March, June, September, December). This should take about half a day, recording emu sightings through a mobile application
- Where: We need volunteers located in the Eurobodalla area, Tidbinbilla (Canberra) area and Yuragir (Grafton) area.
