Project overview

Emus have a fascinating mating and parental care system. This will be the first study to gain fine scale detail on the mating system of the emu in the wild. We will be tracking emus in attempt to locate nests, and placing cameras to film the incubating period.

What's required

- What's required: Dedicated volunteers to spend one day a fortnight undertaking VHF tracking. A moderate level of fitness (extensive walking). Transport to and from the park on unsealed roads. The willingness to work independently
- Where: Wianamatta Regional Park (map below).
- When: We are needing commitment from volunteers for one day a fortnight from the beginning of April until the end of July.
